



# EVERY THING YOU WANTED TO KNOW ABOUT THE PEACE POSTER AND ESSAY CONTEST, BUT WERE AFRAID TO ASK

1) Is it too late to sponsor a school with 11, 12 and 13 year old students?

The kits are available from the Club Supplies Sales Department until October 1, 2021, but the sooner you contact a school the better to get the poster and essay theme integrated into the teachers' plans with information about requirements and deadlines. So, call schools even before the kits arrive.

2) What type of awards should be given to students?

Your club decides, but it could, for example, be cash, gift certificates for merchandise or family restaurant meals for 1st through 3rd place and could include honorable mention awards. The kit includes certificates that can be personalized and given out. If more than one school is sponsored, it is recommended that the same awards be given to each school.

3) Is the theme for the poster and the essay "We Are All Connected"?

Yes. There have been amazing past winners, but our primary goal is to get the kids thinking about peace and to have an opportunity to express themselves artistically and through words. There is one winner determined by your club for each school sponsored.

4) In addition to the age requirements as of November 15, are there other rules?

Yes, so it is important to read the rules yourself and to get the kits to the teachers involved so that rules regarding paper size and typing rules are understood!

- 4) What deadlines are there for clubs, districts and multiples?
  - 11/15 Postmark deadline for clubs to send one winning poster per contest sponsored to the District Governor (DG);
  - 12/1 Postmark deadline for DG to send one winning district poster to the Multiple District Council Chair (MDCC);
  - 12/15 Postmark deadline for the MDCC to send one New Mexico winning poster to the Brand and Marketing Strategy Department
  - 2/1 International Winners are notified on or before this date! Grand prize is the same for poster and essay winner \$5000!

Here is the AdultSight Eyeglasses application that can be given out to community members statewide that have current prescriptions. If they do not have a current prescription have them add "Need Eye Exam" to the bottom of the application and we will refer qualified applicants to the closest participating office for their eye exam and glasses through the VSP Gift Certificate program. All applications for assistance should be returned to the Central Office in Las Cruces for processing if your club does not have the financial means to help them.

For eyeglasses only requests, if your club has the Changing Life Through Lenses sample frame kit we will contact you after processing each of your referrals applications with the next step in the process for you to help your referral.

If your club does not have the frames kit we will either arrange to send a loaner frames kit to you/your club that will need to be mailed back to the Central Office when the selection has been made. Then you can set up a meeting with your referral for them to choose their frames or we can email frames pictures to your referral to choose their frame by picture alone.

The purpose of this is, if there is a member in your club or a friend that has no family close and there is an emergency, the ER Companion (Buddy) has a copy of these forms that they will have at the ER so the buddy can have the patients info, and be there to ask and answer questions for the patient and have the instructions from the doctor to relay to the patient after release.

I believed this is a project that all of us could participate in. We all know a fellow Lion or have a friend or neighbor that we could help using these forms.

#### TIPS TO GET THROUGH AN EMERGENCY ROOM VISIT

(For patients, ER companion or POA/Health Proxy)

\*\*Only use the ER if it is a true life-threatening emergency; utilize your primary care provider, if possible, as they may be able to direct your care to a specialty clinic or Urgent Care, avoiding the ER altogether\*\*

Many people need assistance AFTER an ER visit. Many patients do not fully understand their diagnosis or treatment plan upon discharge which can negatively affect patient outcomes and continuing care. Patients and/or their ER companion can help prevent "ER confusion" by following some basic guidelines.

#### **BRING A BUDDY!**

- This person will help ask questions and gather information if you are too unwell to do so.
- This person should be ready to listen and record the details of your visit such as tests, diagnosis, new medication list, and any follow up notes
- This person should assist in calling/informing your POA, Health Proxy or family members.

#### REMEMBER:

 Be patient! Patients in the ER are treated based on severity; be prepared for a long wait (bring a book or electronic device). If you have a choice, try to go during the week 7A-3P (when people are most likely to be in school or at work). If symptoms worsen while you wait, tell an ER staff member.

HOW CAN YOU BEST ADVOCATE FOR YOURSELF, (or HOW CAN YOUR ER COMPANION BEST SUPPORT YOU) ONCE YOU ARE IN ER

- Succinctly tell the staff why you are there. If this is an on-going medical problem, what made you come to the ER this time?
- Don't exaggerate symptoms
- Be prepared to answer: What makes your symptoms worse? What makes them better? What have you
  tried to improve your symptoms?
- Be prepared to tell you story over and over. Be patient and keep telling it thoroughly. Each person needs
  to hear the whole story; don't assume information is being communicated from one provider to the next.
- You or your ER Companion are the best source of information for the event leading to the ER visit so be forthright with any additional information you think is pertinent

#### WHAT TO BRING (Medical History Sheet)

- A list of all allergies including medications, food, latex etc...
- A CURRENT medication list.
- All doctor/provider information and ICE (In Case of Emergency) contact information
- ID card and insurance information
- Living will/POLST (Physicians Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment)

#### MOST IMPORTANTLY: SPEAK UP and ASK QUESTIONS!!!!

- Play nice: advocating for self or others does not include aggressive behavior or language; be firm and persistent but keep your cool.
- Make sure you know exactly what the plan is <u>before</u> leaving the ER. Read the discharge summary before
  you leave and ask for clarification if it is not clear. You should understand:
  - Reason and results (if available) of tests performed
  - o Diagnosis and Treatment Plan
  - New medication
  - What symptoms would cause you to return to the ER?
  - What is the follow-up plan? i.e. Do I need to see my own doctor? If yes, so I make the
    appointment? Do I need to return to ER on a certain date? Go to physical therapy? See a
    specialist? etc.

## **Involve a Veteran Program**



#### Fact Sheet

Lions Clubs International offers an entrance/charter fee waiver to qualifying veteran and active duty military/armed forces service

- This program will be eligible to the first 5,000 certified veteran or active duty service members from all Lions constitutional areas and will run through June 30, 2021.
- Eligible persons for this program include active duty, retired and honorably discharged service members including National
  Guard and Reserve personnel who were called to active duty for other than training of governmentally recognized service
  branches from countries within Lions' scope of service (see Lions Clubs International Board Policy).
- 3. The Involve a Veteran Certification Form must be completed by the district governor or club secretary of the appropriate district of club. The form must be submitted to Lions Clubs International's Accounts Receivable and Club Account Services Department when reporting a new member using: MyLCI, Report of Charter Members for new clubs, or EMMR (Electronic Monthly Membership Report) for existing clubs. All information requested must be provided to avoid certification and processing delays. The fee waiver will be processed as a credit on the Lions club billing statement upon receipt of the certification form.
- Clubs are encouraged to sponsor or defray club, district and multiple district and/or international dues for any eligible service member needing financial assistance.

#### Frequently Asked Questions - FAQ

- ? Where can I obtain an Involve a Veteran Certification Form?
  - The Veteran Certification Form can be downloaded from the LCI website or requested by emailing membership@lionsclubs.org
- ? Can existing Lions benefit from the Veteran Program?
  - No, the program is an incentive for new members to existing or new clubs.
- ? Can a members eligible for the Veteran Program also take advantage of other Lions discount programs?
  - Yes. As an example, a new member can qualify for both a charter/entrance fee waiver under the Veteran Program as well as a student dues discount if they meet the eligibility requirements for both programs.

## **Involve a Veteran Program**

#### Qualification Criteria

Eligible persons for the Involve a Veteran Program membership benefit may receive an entrance or charter fee waiver when joining a Lions club.

The entrance or charter fee waiver is available for up to 5,000 qualifying members.

Eligible persons for this benefit include active duty, retired and honorably discharged military service members - including National Guard and Reserve personnel called to active duty for other than training - from governmentally recognized service branches serving in countries or territories listed in Lions Clubs International's Board Policy.

The benefit runs through June 30, 2021.

#### Certification Form

An Involve a Veteran Certification Form must be submitted to Lions Clubs International's Accounts Receivable and Club Account
Services Department when reporting a new member using: MyLCI, Report of Charter Members for new clubs, or EMMR (Electronic
Monthly Membership Report) for existing clubs. All information requested must be provided to avoid certification and processing
delays.

The fee waiver will be processed as a credit on the Lions club billing statement upon receipt of the certification form.

#### Certification of Members

The district governor or club secretary is responsible for collecting, reviewing and maintaining copies of verification documents provided by the military service member. Documents provided should satisfy qualification criteria. Copies of verification documents SHOULD NOT be sent to LCI, but may be requested.

#### Definition

Military service is service by an individual or group in an army or other militia, whether as a chosen job or as a result of an involuntary draft, and for purposes of this benefit includes those individuals committed to Lions Clubs International's Purpose and Code of Ethics.

RECYCLING - The Center checks hearing aids first to see if they can be cleaned and used as loaners to clients waiting for hearing aids. If not, they are sent to a company named Starkey who saves parts for requested repairs.

HEARING AID BANK - The Albuquerque Speech Language and Hearing Center 's Hearing Aid Bank (HAB) is designed to assist people with limited resources to obtain entry level digital hearing aids at a reduced cost. The program is made possible, in part, by funding from United Way of New Mexico and is available to anyone in the State, not just Albuquerque. They received \$41,000 from United Way in 2012-2013.
